



hen WerM GALA was formed in 1986, the College had no policies barring discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation. It was against the law for a public place for gays and leabians. It was against the law to serve alcohol to gays and lesbians in Virginia. In 1986, the College had little or no resources for dealing with the needs of lesbian and gay students. Gay and lesbian alumni/a had no formal means of networking or socializing.

Since then a lot has changed.

We'M GALA has grown into a nationwide network of hundreds of loyal alumni/æ with a demonstrated ability to make things happen:

 We were the major force in lobbying the College to include sexual orientation in its non-discrimination policies.

 As a result of a lawsuit filed by W&M GALA, among others, Virginia over-





turned its Alcoholic Beverage Control laws; a code which specifically discriminated against lesbians and gays.

- We established a \$25,000 endowment fund for purchasing gay and lesbian resource materials for Swem Library.
- We provided funds for programs sponsored by Alternatives, the student group which serves the needs of gay and lesbian students.
- We provided the Student Health Center with funds to participate in an AIDS education teleconference.
- We have spoken on campus to lesbian and gay student groups to prepare them for the challenges they will face in the business world.
- We provided financial assistance to train College personnel on dealing

with the needs of lesbian and gay students.

 At each Homecoming, W& M GALA sponsors a full schedule of events, including a cocktail reception, a Sunday brunch, and a hospitality suite open all weekend.

 Throughout the year, we hold events where members can socialize, network, and remember our years in Williamsburg.


W&M GALA is making history, and the fight is far from over.

VA. ABC BOARD SETTLES GALA LAWSUIT

Concedes Anti-gay Statute Unconstitutional

William and Mary GALA schieved its greatest victory to date in wirming a highly-favorable settlement of the lawait it filds law Aquate against the Vinghia Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board. The final order ending the mitwas issues by the U.S. Duriter Court in the Eastern District of Vigniais on October 29, 1991. In the order the Court:

> Declared unconstitutional those sections of the Virginia Code authorizing the ABC Board to revolve or suspend the liquor licenses of establishments which employ or serve as meeting places for homosexuals;

2. Directed the ABC Board to formally notify all ABC licensets of the revocation of these unconstitutional provisions; and

 Ordered the Commonwealth of Virginia to pay court costs and legal fees incurred as a result of the August lassuit in the amount of \$11,275.

The order met all the major demands put forth by William and Mary GALA and its two co-plaintifis, the French Qarrer Cafe, an Alexandria gay bar, and Dale Bambard, a lobian activita. It was based on an agreement reached between the office of Virginia Attorney General Mary Sue Terry and attorneys for the plaintific, civil rights lawyen Vic Clatherg and Ken Labowite.

John E. Boswell, 47, Historian Of Medieval Gay Culture, Dies

John Eastburn Boswell, a Yale University historian who upended medieval scholarship by finding not only that homosexuality was tolerated in the Middle Ages but that samesex unions were celebrated liturgically, died yesterday in the Yale infirmary. He was 47 and lived in New Haven.

The cause was complications from AIDS, a friend, Jerry Harr, said. Award f "Ir regard him as one of the major imnovative figures in gay and lesbian scholarship," said Martin Duber man, founder and executive director of the Center for Lesbian and Gay Studies at the City University of New


